Camping Information

About the Campground

The primitive campground open for reservable stays from Memorial Day weekend through Columbus Day weekend.

Facilities, Services and Amenities

Water, pit toilets, a playground, kayak and canoe rentals, boat launch (for non-motorized boats), and firewood are available. Eleven of the 41 campsites are remote and accessible by foot or canoe only. Rental boats may be reserved by calling the park directly. All pit toilets are handicap accessible.

Activities

Enjoy canoeing, warm-water fishing, and hiking. The 51-mile Monadnock-Sunapee Greenway traverses the park lands.

About the Policies

- Campers with a reservation must register at the campground office between 1 pm and 8 pm. Check-out time is 11 am.
- Payment due upon registration may be made by cash, voucher, money order, or traveler's check only. Credit cards and personal checks are not accepted.
- Visitors are required to pay the day-use fee and may visit in the campground during posted visitor hours.
- Quiet hours are from 10 pm to 7 am.
- Bring trash and recycling to the recycling station.
- Pets are permitted, but must be leashed and attended to at all times.
- Cutting standing trees and shrubs and using power saws is prohibited.
- Your camping permit may be presented at nearby Mt. Sunapee State Beach for free picnicking and swimming.
- RVs are not permitted in youth group areas.
- Firewood is a major carrier of exotic insects and tree diseases. Please do not bring firewood from out-of-state locations.
- Fire pits are now permitted at canoe campsites.

For Your Safety

Do not invite raccoons or other wild animals into the campground or to your campsite. Keep a clean site by disposing of food waste and scraps properly. Coolers left out are easily opened by raccoons. Be sure to remove all food items from tables and tents and secure them in your vehicle at night.

Reservations may be made by calling ReserveAmerica at 1-877-647-2757, or online at nhstateparks.org. Youth group camping reservations are not available online.
