

FRANCES SLOCUM STATE PARK

Trails: 13.7 miles

Bluebird Trail: 0.5 mile

Easiest hiking | Out-and-back trail | Yellow blazes
Recreations permitted: hiking

In the northern portion of the park, this trail passes through fields and mixed forests.

Buck Trail: 0.8 mile

More difficult hiking | Connector trail | Red blazes
Recreations permitted: hiking, mountain biking

While skirting stone walls and old fields and passing through stands of pines, this trail connects to Maconaquah Trail in several places.

Campground Trail: 1.0 mile

More difficult hiking | Loop trail | Yellow blazes
Recreations permitted: hiking, snowmobiling

Trailhead amenities: modern restrooms
Hikers can access this trail from the amphitheater parking lot in Stony Point. Enjoy hiking through the quiet forest surrounding the campground. A short stretch of Campground Trail overlaps with Larch Tree Trail. To make a complete loop, walk the campground roads from the organized group tenting area back to the amphitheater parking lot.

Deer Trail: 3.2 miles

Most difficult hiking | Out-and-back trail | Yellow/Red blazes

Recreations permitted: hiking, mountain biking
Trailhead amenities: modern restrooms, picnic table, benches

This trail passes through an incredibly diverse woodland which includes a variety of wildlife habitats and historic areas. Hike through beautiful pines, across bridges, down an old macadam road, and across concrete stepping stones in the marshy area.

Doe Trail: 0.3 mile

More difficult hiking | Connector trail | Red blazes
Recreations permitted: hiking, mountain biking

In the southwestern part of the park, this multi-use trail connects Buck and Maconaquah trails.

Frances Slocum Trail: 0.7 mile

Easiest hiking | Loop trail | Yellow blazes
Recreations permitted: hiking

Trailhead amenities: modern restrooms, picnic tables
Near the education center, this short loop climbs a hill up to the famous rock formation. Explore the rock shelter where the park's namesake, Frances Slocum, and her Lenape captors may have taken shelter.

Hilltop Loop Trail: 0.7 mile

More difficult hiking | Loop trail | Red blazes
Recreations permitted: hiking, mountain biking

This scenic loop trail starts and ends at the Green Road trailhead, traveling through woods and an open field. For a longer hike, connect to Maconaquah Trail or Upper Deer Trail.

Lakeshore Trail: 1.4 miles

Easiest hiking | Out-and-back trail | Yellow blazes
Recreations permitted: hiking

Trailhead amenities: modern restrooms, benches
Take a peaceful walk along the water's edge on the Lakeshore Trail. This trail begins at the parking near Turtle Pond or in the Big Pines Picnic Area.

Larch Tree Trail: 2.0 miles

More difficult hiking | Loop trail | Yellow blazes
Recreations permitted: hiking, snowmobiling

Enjoy hiking through a lush forest featuring larch and red pine trees. This loop trail begins and ends on Campground Road near Turtle Pond.

Maconaquah Trail: 2.5 miles

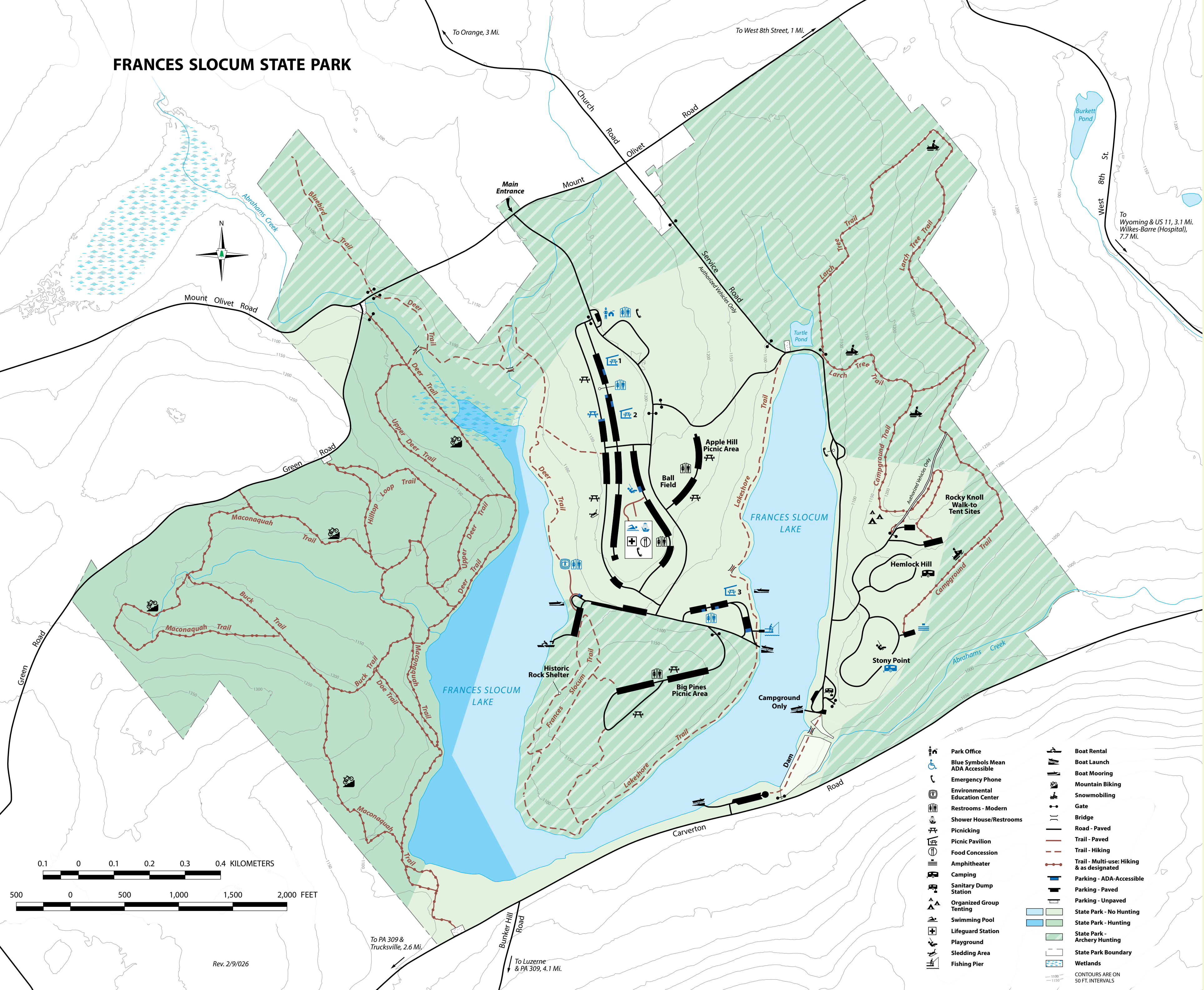
Most difficult hiking | Loop trail | Red blazes
Recreations permitted: hiking, mountain biking

This popular mountain biking trail starts and ends at the Carverton Road or Green Road trailheads. The loop connects to many of the trails in the mountain biking area.

Upper Deer Trail: 0.6 mile

More difficult hiking | Connector trail | Red blazes
Recreations permitted: hiking, mountain biking

This trail connects Deer Trail to Hilltop Loop through a mixed hardwood hillside on the western side of the lake.
