

Lower Lake Campground

Lower Lake Campground has modern campsites (electric, non-electric, full-hookup, and pet-friendly), equestrian camping, and glamping sites.

Hemlock Hill Equestrian Camping Area has six equestrian campsites, each with a stall that holds up to four horses. The camping area has non-flush restrooms, potable water, and a manure pit. It is adjacent to horse trails in Delaware State Forest.

Ten glamping sites are available in partnership with Timberline Glamping. Glamp in comfort and style in a spacious safari tent featuring hotel-style beds with linens, air conditioning, heat, electric, refrigerator, and coffee maker. Glamping sites do not have water, but a shower house is nearby.

State Park Reservations: Most campsites can be reserved 11 months in advance to noon of the day of arrival. For reservations, cancellations, or changes prior to arrival, contact the Pennsylvania State Parks Reservation Center at 888-PA-PARKS or www.pa.gov/state-parks.

Glamping Reservations: Glamping sites must be reserved in advance through Timberline Glamping. www.timberlineglamping.com

Campsite Issuing: Unreserved sites are available on a first-come, first-served basis. If an employee is not available, read posted instructions and check the site availability listing. The appropriate fee must be paid before setting up on a campsite.

Fees: For complete information on fees, cancellations, changes, transfers, and discount policies, view the Reservation Cancellation/Change Policy on the Pennsylvania State Park website.

Campground Rules

Camping Season: Beechwood, Northwoods, and Hemlock Hill areas open in early May and close in mid-October. Rhododendron Area is open from Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day.

Check-in/Check-out: Check-in time is 3:00 PM. Campsites must be vacated by 3:00 PM. Glamping sites must be vacated by 10:00 AM.

Alcoholic Beverages: Alcoholic beverages are prohibited in all Pennsylvania state parks.

Pets: Pets are permitted at designated campsites in this campground. Please contact the park office for pet guidelines.

Pets are prohibited in swimming areas, buildings, and all overnight facilities not participating in the pet program. Guide dogs and service dogs are not considered pets.

Quiet Hours: Campers must minimize noise between the hours of 9:00 PM and 8:00 AM.

Noise: Operation of electric generators that create excessive noise is prohibited.

Motor Vehicles: Park only in designated areas. Only one vehicle is permitted at a campsite in addition to a camping unit. If permitted, additional vehicles can park on the camping spur for a fee or in the second car parking area at no charge.

Visitors: Visitors are welcome on campsites from 8:00 AM to 10:00 PM.

Minimum/Maximum Camping Period: Campers may stay in a state park campground up to 14 consecutive nights from Memorial Day to Labor Day. If reserving a Saturday during the summer season, a two-night minimum stay is required. Campers may camp up to 21 consecutive nights during the remainder of the year.

Protect and Preserve Our Parks

Please make your visit safe and enjoyable. Obey all posted rules and regulations and respect fellow visitors and the resources of the park.

- Be prepared and bring the proper equipment. Natural areas may possess hazards. Your personal safety and that of your family are your responsibility.
- Please camp only in designated areas and minimize your impact on the campsite.
- Prevent wild fires. Fires are only permitted in fire rings or grills. Fires must be attended at all times and extinguished before leaving a campsite. Properly dispose of hot coals.
- Firewood is not provided. Cutting live or standing trees and the operation of chainsaws are prohibited.
- Handwashing and dishwashing are prohibited at water spigots, hand pumps, springs, lakes, and streams.
- Because uncontrolled pets may chase wildlife or frighten visitors, pets must be physically controlled, attended at all times, and on a leash, caged, or crated. Electronic fences and leashes are prohibited.
- Do your part to keep wildlife wild! Enjoy wildlife from a safe distance and do not feed or approach wild animals. Human food is unhealthy for animals and animals dependent on human food can lead to dangerous human-animal encounters.
