

Promised Land State Park

Deerfield campground is south of Promised Land Lake and offers only non-electric, pet-friendly campsites with a few pull-thru sites. The modern restroom has flush toilets. Pay showers are available in the day use area.

Pickerel Point Campground, on a peninsula of Promised Land Lake, has modern campsites (electric, full-hookup, non-electric walk-to, and pet-friendly) and three camping cottages. Walk-to sites do not have electricity and require a short hike from the parking area to the campsite. Camping cottages sleep five people in single bunk beds and double/ single bunk beds. They have a dining table and chairs, porch, electric heat, lights, and outlets. The sanitary dump station, amphitheater, park auditorium, Masker Museum, and blacksmith shop are between the two campgrounds. The swimming beach, boat mooring, and boat rental are at the tip of the peninsula.

Reservations: Most campsites can be reserved 11 months in advance to noon of the day of arrival. Campers without a reservation arriving after noon should check at the contact station or near the campground entrance for instructions. For reservations, cancellations, or changes prior to arrival, call the Pennsylvania State Parks Reservation Center.

Campsite Issuing: Unreserved sites are available on a first-come, first-served basis. If an employee is not available, read posted instructions and check the site availability listing.

The appropriate fee must be paid to a park employee or deposited in a supplied honor system envelope before setting up on a campsite.

Fees: For complete information on fees, cancellations, changes, transfers, and discount policies, view the Reservation Cancellation/Change Policy on the Pennsylvania State Park website.

Campground Rules

Camping Season: Deerfield Campground is open Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day. Pickerel Point Campground has some campsites open year round, but access is not always guaranteed during severe winter weather.

Check-in/Check-out: Check-in time is 3:00 PM. Campsites must be vacated by 3:00 PM. Camping cottages must be vacated by 10:00 AM.

Alcoholic Beverages: Alcoholic beverages are prohibited in all Pennsylvania state parks.

Pets: Pets are permitted at all campsites in Deerfield Campground and designated campsites in Pickerel Point Campground. Please contact the park office for guidelines for pets.

Pets are prohibited in swimming areas, buildings, and all overnight facilities not participating in the pet program. Guide dogs and service dogs are not considered pets.

Quiet Hours: Campers must not disturb the sleep of others between 9:00 PM and 8:00 AM.

Noise: Operation of electric generators that create excessive noise is prohibited.

Motor Vehicles: Park only in designated areas. Only one vehicle is permitted at a campsite in addition to a camping unit. If permitted, additional vehicles can park on the camping spur for a fee or in the second car parking area at no charge.

Visitors: Visitors are welcome on campsites from 8:00 AM to 10:00 PM.

Minimum/Maximum Camping Period: Campers may stay in a state park campground up to 14 consecutive nights from Memorial Day to Labor Day. If reserving a Saturday during the summer season, a two-night minimum stay is required. Campers may camp up to 21 consecutive nights during the remainder of the year.

Protect and Preserve Our Parks

Please make your visit safe and enjoyable. Obey all posted rules and regulations and respect fellow visitors and the resources of the park.

- Be prepared and bring the proper equipment. Natural areas may possess hazards. Your personal safety and that of your family are your responsibility.
- Please camp only in designated areas and minimize your impact on the campsite.
- Prevent wild fires. Fires are only permitted in fire rings or grills. Fires must be attended at all times and extinguished before leaving a campsite. Properly dispose of hot coals.
- Firewood is not provided. Cutting live or standing trees and the operation of chainsaws are prohibited.
- Handwashing and dishwashing are prohibited at water spigots, hand pumps, springs, lakes, and streams.
- Because uncontrolled pets may chase wildlife or frighten visitors, pets must be physically controlled, attended at all times, and on a leash, caged, or crated. Electronic fences and leashes are prohibited.
- Do your part to keep wildlife wild! Enjoy wildlife from a safe distance and do not feed or approach wild animals. Human food is unhealthy for animals and animals dependent on human food can lead to dangerous human-animal encounters.

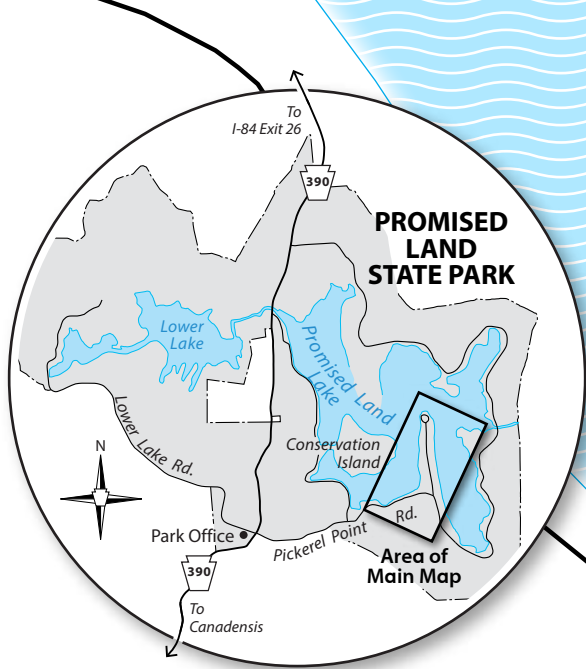

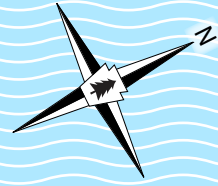

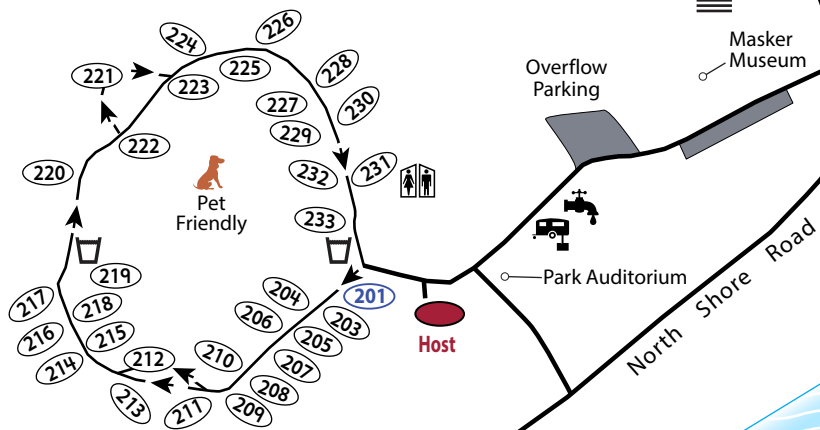
