A complete list of rules and regulations is posted at each restroom and answers to the most commonly asked questions are listed to the right. Please contact a park ranger if you have any other questions, and we hope you have a safe and memorable experience at Oconee State Park.

CAMPING INFORMATION

The main campground offers campsites with individual water and electrical hookups and a picnic table with some sites offering sewer hookups. While tent campers may use the sites with water and electrical hookups, a designated walk-in tent camping area, located near sites 70 and 75 of the main campground, includes tent areas (limit two tents per site) and centralized water (located at the parking area). Each campground is convenient to restrooms with hot showers.

When reserving your site, please see the site details for the equipment each site can accommodate and driveway length.

CAMPING RESERVATIONS

To make a camping reservation, call toll-free 1-866-345-PARK (7275) or reserve online by clicking Park Reservation. Camping reservations must be made for a minimum of two nights.

Reservations requested less than one (1) day in advance of check-in must be made directly through the park. For example: If today is Friday and you are making a reservation to check in today, you must make the reservation by contacting the park directly.

PRIMITIVE GROUP AREA

A primitive group camping area is ideal for organized groups up to 50 people. (An organized group is defined as a group that holds regular meetings and has a lead officer or elected/appointed officials.) The area includes central water and nearby restroom facilities. Reservations are accepted.

To make a primitive group camping reservation, contact the park directly.

PETS

Pets are allowed in cabins 14-20 at Oconee. Pets are not allowed in any other cabin or the cabin areas. Pets are allowed in most other outdoor areas provided they are kept under physical restraint or on a leash not longer than six feet.

ANSWERS TO COMMONLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

- Dial 911 in an emergency.
- Alcoholic beverages are prohibited.
- Fireworks are prohibited.
- Quiet hours are from 10 p.m. – 7 a.m., including pets.
- Tents must be on the tent pads or paved portion of the standard (RV) sites with a maximum of six people per site.
- All vehicles must remain on paved portions of the campsite. No vehicles will be permitted to park on grass, mulch, road shoulders, adjacent sites or other locations in the campground.
- Due to wildlife activity and to protect the park's resources from litter, secure all bagged food and trash in an enclosed vehicle or camper outside of designated trash pickup times.
- Parking for tent sites 1-15 is in the main campground. Only one vehicle per site may be parked in their designated site. All additional vehicles or trailers need to park in the overflow or trailer parking areas and must display a valid parking pass.
- Campfires must be contained inside the fire ring that is provided for each site.
- No campfires on lakeshore.
- Generators are not allowed.
- Any guest not staying overnight needs to pay the park admission fee.
- Standard RV sites are allowed a maximum of two vehicles at the site (this includes golf carts and trailers). All additional vehicles need to park in the designated overflow parking areas or the front office parking lot and display a valid parking pass.
- Campground trash is collected by park staff. Staff designated hours for pickup are mornings at 8:30 a.m. and in the afternoon at 4 p.m. Please station all properly contained trash by your site post for pickup only at these designated times.
- All campsites may be reserved in advance. Any empty site does not mean it is an available site.
- Golf carts must be driven and parked on paved or established roads and parking areas. Golf carts are considered a vehicle. You must be a licensed driver to operate the golf cart, and they cannot be driven after dark. You must have all permits as required by the SCDMV.
