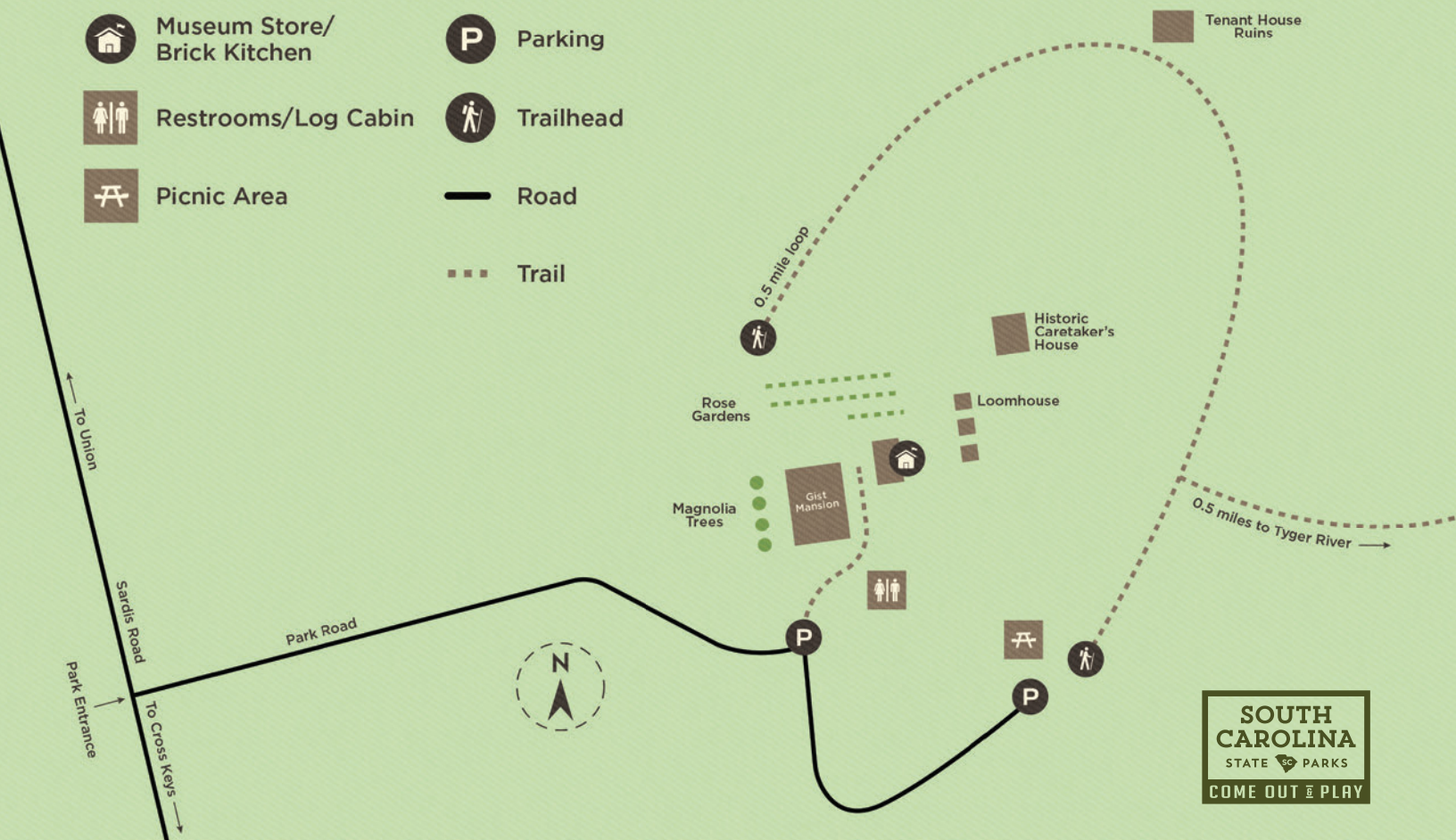

ROSE HILL PLANTATION STATE HISTORIC SITE

This site in upstate South Carolina preserves part of a former cotton plantation that was active from 1811 to 1939. It is now a place to discover the complex history of the antebellum period, Reconstruction and the Jim Crow era. At the site's center sits the home of "Secession Governor" William Henry Gist and his family. Generations of African Americans lived and labored here, both during and after slavery.

Today, visitors can take guided tours of the Gist Mansion and explore the historic grounds and gardens. Witness trees, archaeological sites and wildlife are visible along the park's trails.

Rose Hill is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and is part of the Reconstruction Era National Historic Network.
