

Please make your visit enjoyable and safe by following these guidelines:

Parking is allowed on paved, designated areas only.
Trash should be placed in dumpsters available throughout the park. This includes picnic refuse, extinguished cigarette butts, fishing lines, cans and bottles, etc. Campground waste should be deposited into the large dumpsters in the camping areas.

Dogs are welcome at Willard Bay State Park but must remain under control on a 6-foot leash at all times.

Fires are permitted only in designated campgrounds with fire rings. No unattended fires. No firewood gathering. Purchase firewood in the general store and/or camp host.

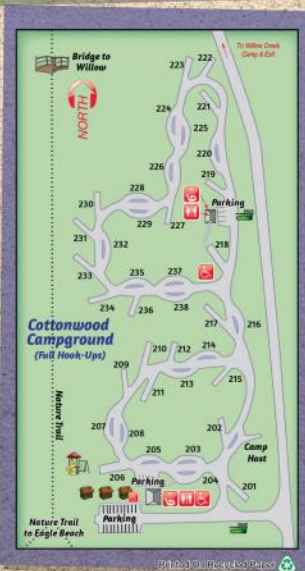
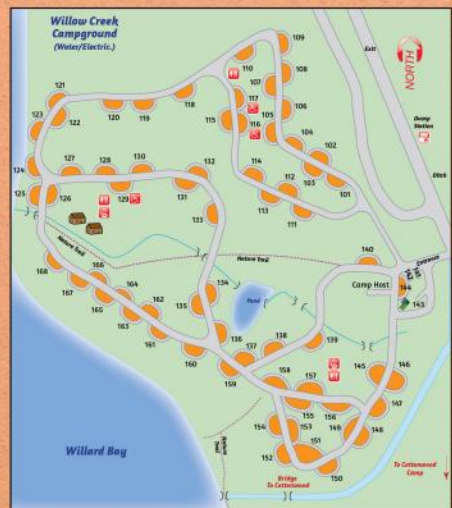
Campers: Check-In: 3:00 PM | Check-Out: 1:00 PM. Quiet hours are 10:00 PM to 6:00 AM. Sound carries throughout the park; please respect others by keeping noise to a minimum at all times.

Boaters: You must follow all laws and regulations pertaining to boating. Boaters are reminded to follow quagga mussel decontamination certification.

Anglers: You may clean your fish only at the fish cleaning station located at the top of both boat ramps.

Day-Use and Camping Fees are required year round. Annual permits for frequent visitors are available at the entrance stations.

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WELCOME TO WILLARD BAY STATE PARK

Willard Bay rests atop the Great Salt Lake flood plain in Northern Utah. Its 9,900 acres of fresh water provide boating, water-skiing and year-round fishing for crappie, walleye, wiper and catfish. Camping also is popular at the park.

Two state-owned facilities are available to recreationists. The North Marina and Campgrounds is 15 miles north of Ogden, just off Interstate 15 (exit 357). The park has full hookups and power & water with the dump

station as you exit. 3 cabins with bunk beds, refrigerator, microwave and futon; and modern restrooms, hot showers, sewage disposal station, and sandy beaches. Group day use sites are also available. Cottages available for reservation.

The South Marina and Campground is 8 miles north of Ogden, also off Interstate 15 (exit 351). The campground provides full hook-up campsites, boat launch and modern restrooms.
