

WILLAPA HILLS STATE PARK TRAIL

This multiuse trail weaves a path through pastoral valleys and forested hills. A railroad provided freight and passenger service to small towns that grew around sawmills in the late 1800s. Logging slowed and communities shrank when the old growth timber was gone. Rail service ended in 1990, and the line was “railbanked” for recreation. Willapa Hills State Park Trail was dedicated in 1996.



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TRAIL DEVELOPMENT STAGES

- Paved - Fully Improved**
Surface conditions are generally consistent, typically crushed rock or treated/compacted railbed, many restored bridges/trestles have concrete surfaces
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- Minimally Treated**
Moderately variable surface conditions ranging from original railbed to crushed rock surfacing
- Unimproved**
Unimproved railbed, highly variable surface conditions, some sections may be impassable
